

2012 Civitas Award Presentation by John Powers

It is my honor and distinct pleasure, to announce the recipient of the I'On Civitas Award for 2012.

For those of you who don't know, the Civitas Award was created in 2004 to recognize individuals within the I'On Community who have provided outstanding community service to make I'On a better place to live. Civitas is the Latin word for Citizenship - especially as imparting a sense of shared responsibility, a common purpose, and sense of community.

The Civitas Award is presented to those members of the I'On community whose course of leadership has materially enhanced the community through new projects and initiatives (which may include improvement of existing programs and activities) in the areas of civic, cultural and social life.

While many volunteers are needed to keep I'On running the way it does, this award recognizes those few individuals who go above and beyond the call. Not just on one occasion, but usually several, over many years. Often times, their body of work isn't particularly glamorous or even that obvious, but it is constant and makes a significant contribution to the betterment of I'On. This award is not won. It is earned.

The recipient of the award is selected by a committee made up of a representative from the HOA Board, the I'On Trust, BizNet as well as the 4 most recent recipients of the award. There may come a year where no one is honored. There have been years where two recipients were chosen. So far, 12 I'On neighbors have been recognized with this honor.
