Responsible Pet Owners Appreciated, submitted by Anonymous.

While jogging last month, I was knocked down by an unleashed dog. While on the ground, the large dog was exceedingly attentive and wouldn't leave me alone. The dog owner, at a distance with leash in hand, finally got the dog to return to her. This neighbor was also attentive and when she saw I was limping, she kindly offered me a ride home. However, with my bloody knee and hand, and needing to get ready to go out of town for a family vacation, I declined the offer. I responded that I wished she had kept her dog on the leash. This is an unfortunate way for any of us to start a day, and I'm certainly uncomfortable with this being my first exchange with a new neighbor.

The Mt. Pleasant city ordinance states: "the action of an animal constitutes a nuisance when an animal disturbs the rights of, threatens the safety of, or damages a member of the general public...it is declared to be a public nuisance and therefore unlawful to allow an animal to run without control or not under constraint...and if a complaint is lodged against an animal that has a nuisance act only, the owner will be notified and shall correct the situation or the animal will be impounded."

No one wants to be in the position of asking animal control to visit offending neighbors. But residents should not be asked to cope with unleashed pets that can become a nuisance. I'm aware that I am not the first I'On resident to be injured in a pet related fall. It is my hope that we can all enjoy this lovely community space. While it's a joy to see a dog free to run, it's also a right for people to feel safe to run in I'On.



Eastlake Boathouse and Unattended Boats. As summer approaches, I'm writing (as Chair of the I'On Boathouse Committee) to remind residents about rules and guidelines for safe and neighborly use of the Boathouse and lakes. The Boathouse is a wonderful amenity for us all and is well used. It was repaired, cleaned and re-painted last summer, so it's in especially good condition. The I'On Yacht Club has boats for residents' use (on certification by the Yacht Club) and is planning a variety of activities on the lakes. As you and your children and guests use the Boathouse, please remember the following rules established in by the I'On Assembly Board of Trustees:

- No lifeguard on duty.
- Swim at your own risk.
- Children under 14 prohibited from swimming unless accompanied by an adult.
- No jumping or diving from upper deck of Boathouse.
- Beware of alligators.
- Facility for use of I'On residents and their guests only.
- Police have jurisdiction.

In addition, Assembly Board policy prohibits storing or leaving personal boats overnight in common areas; this includes the Boathouse, the lakeshores and docks. "Boats left unattended in common areas will be removed. *(Continued Next Page)*

(Unattended Boats Continued) Owners can re-claim them by paying a \$25 fee within the first week. This fee will increase by \$25 per week for each additional week or portion thereof, in which the boat is unclaimed." This policy is intended to help maintain the beauty and safety of our lakes.
