I'On Square Enhancement Project:

March 201 2 Infrastructure Update

- a. Follow-Up needed for discussion on Thomas and Hutton Engineering Proposal with fees proposed for crosswalk project. Proposal includes survey, time, design and permitting process (proposal in February minutes).
- b. Paperwork on the Storm Drains with all the documentation (plats, deeds, all relevant versions of the ordinances, and developer-signed maintenance agreements with the State) including a poster-board that shows where the weirs are in the neighborhood has been transferred to the AMCS office for safe keeping.

Latitude Lane Alley Handover

<u>Background</u>: The I'On Company has requested handover take place of a paved homeowner alley/common area recently constructed between Latitude Lane and Jefferson Canal. As constructed...

The width of the common area is 20 feet

The width of the paved alley is 10 feet, and the paved alley appears to be centered within the 20 foot common area

As a result there appears to be a 5 footunimproved section on each side of the paved alley

<u>History</u>: Prior HOA alleys in I'On have been constructed in a similar fashion, which have resulted in rutted corners from homeowner inability to navigate the hard right angle turn while keeping all 4 wheels on the pavement. The alley between Ionsborough Street and the B raemore development provides a representative example. As a result of the narrow lane and the hard right turns, deep ruts were created by homeowner traffic. The I'On Company installed corner pavers at one of the lane entrances to help mitigate the situation, and post handover the Assembly spent another \$5,000 to add to the initial corner pavers and also add corner pavers to the other entrances to the alley.

Assessment: Given the narrow (10 foot) width of the alley off Latitude and the resultant hard, right angle turn required, concerns exist regarding the ability for Lots 1 27 and 1 28 to effectively utilize any driveway/garage structures that might be constructed. Potential solutions could include...

Increasing the width of the homeowner alley paving toward Lot 1 26 (lot line) to allow a wider turning radius for accessing Lots 1 27/1 28. This would result in a 15' paved area and also would line up with the walk way to the canal.

Placing IDC building design constraints on Lots 1 27 and 1 28 to ensure adequate turning room exists for homeowners to access garages/parking pads

MARCH 2012 AMENITIES REPORT

Athletic Field (Soccer Field):

Several vehicles continue to park in unmarked spaces during the Saturday morning Suarez Soccer School practice despite being notified to park only in marked spaces. MPPD was called and are aware of the situation and are working on a solution to resolve the congestion. The new entrance to the I'On Club parking lot appears to be nearly completed, which should take some of the pressure off parking on the streets and alleviating the Saturday morning congestion. The Wando Rugby Club, who practice on Tuesday and Thursday evenings, will also be directed to park at the I'On Club upon completion of the parking lot entrance.

Creek Club Docks/Boat Ramp:

An information-gathering meeting was held with Mike Russo and Peggy Thomas concerning their new Rules for Operating and Maintaining the Creek Club at I'On Boat Ramp and Docks and the Fee increase from the previous \$25.00 fee to the new \$100.00 fee in order to obtain a key for the new lock on the boat ramp.

Mr. Russo stated that managing the docks/ramp continues to be problematic as the community has grown. The major reason for the fee increase is that boat facility costs are increasing from a management standpoint because the cost of obtaining and issuing stickers and numbered keys which cannot be duplicated is increasing, and the cost of security fees is rising. In order to manage the area during busy weekends, it really is necessary to hire a dockmaster for ten hours per day to manage the boat ramp/docks. He also hopes to save enough money to purchase security cameras for the docks/ramp. He stated that since the HOA didn't feel that the entire neighborhood should pay when only a few residents actually use the docks/ramp, this was a way of assessing only those who use the facility for the management costs. So far only about five or six new keys have been issued.

He provided examples of some of the problems that have constantly arisen such as nonresident boaters attempting to use the boat ramp who claim to be a friend or relative of an I'On resident (the docks/ramp are for the use of I'On residents only); teenagers congregating on the docks and partying/drinking to the point where residents with young children attempting to use the docks didn't feel comfortable; teenagers congregating and partying in the parking lot; vandalism of boats; boaters leaving their trash everywhere, including the parking lot, rather than taking their trash with them; teenagers or others turning "wheelies" with trucks having large tires in the parking lot and tearing up the parking lot; when the docks are full, boats often tie up side-by-side without using fenders between them and damage the adjacent boat causing complaints from the damaged boat owner; complaints from nearby residents of boat trailers parked on the street, etc. About 5% of those who use the docks/ramp are the troublemakers.

One idea that was discussed to help manage the problems at the docks/ramp would be to notify the entire community that a meeting will be held regarding the rules and regulations for using the docks/ramp, and all those who plan to obtain a key to use the docks/ramp should attend this meeting. Other ideas are welcome.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mid-Year Meeting Date

Security Providers

At the moment, I am still waiting for RFP responses from Signal 88 and Trident Security Services. If I receive them before the Board meeting, I will provide them to Board members right away.

Communications and Directory Update

The newsletter has added Lori DiFilippo as Features Editor. She will be highlighting historical information about I'On, profiling community members and businesses, and writing other feature articles on general community interest. Anyone with suggestions for articles should contact Barb Fry or Lori.

The Directory is on track for early April delivery, under the direction of Doreen Ronchi. The delivery team will deliver the directories in "green" reusable shopping bags donated by Publix (in addition to a \$5-off coupon) by hanging them on non-street-facing doors (where possible). Unclaimed directories will be retrieved three days later, and those who want an alternative delivery method are invited to contact Doreen.

ECMS Agreem ent

The current agreement with the ECMS terminates in April, 2013. It renews automatically unless sooner terminated by the Board or the School. The School is supposed to be making annual payments of \$5300 (increasing by 4% annually) for landscape maintenance, and also to be providing evidence of insurance. We are checking on both these issues.

Creek Club Issues

Community residents are concerned about sharply increased key fees and attempts to impose parking fines, among other newly-announced policies, at the Creek Club. We are awaiting an opinion from our attorney as to the validity of these changes. If I receive an opinion before the Board meeting, I will share it with Board members right away.
