#### I'On Assembly Board Updates

- The Board has been informed by the Town that the request to amend the I'On PD has been withdrawn. In addition, the Board has received very favorable rulings from the judge on post-trial motions in the Creek Club litigation. This news has been communicated in email blasts which you can read <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>. More details will be provided in the September newsletter.
- At the July meeting, the Board approved eliminating Rule D-103, regulating antenna and satellite dish installations. The Assembly Board also approved creation of a new Rule D-110, Minimum Rental Term, in response to neighborhood feedback and recent activity involving illegal operation of B&B's in I'On. 
#### ANATOMY OF A GREAT PORCH:

The I'On Design Committee is often asked "Why can't I screen my front porch?"

Traditionally, in the Lowcountry, the front porch was a gathering place on hot summer evenings in the hopes of catching a light breeze – an escape from the heat of the day still lingering in the home. It was furnished with rocking chairs, a swing and maybe a joggling board. Neighbors passing by would join the family and "sit a spell." It was here that stories were told and laughs were shared over a glass of iced lemonade. The family dog would languish in the shade and the family cat-with-attitude would balance on the porch rail daring anyone to get too close.

Porches in I'On continue this tradition. Railings are placed low enough to encourage conversation with those passing by. Screening is not a welcoming feature; it creates a boundary and limits interaction with the outside world. For this reason screening is not permitted in I'On on primary facades. On corner lots screening is permitted on secondary facades.

Lettuce - Buttercrunch, Deer Tongue & Green Ice

Chard - any variety!

Kale - Siberian Kale (red color is wonderful!)

Herbs - Parsley, Watercress - any variety

Potatoes - Irish Cobbler, Kennebec, Yukon Gold

Cabbage - Bravo, Market Place, Savoy Express

Carrots - Apache, Camden, Chantenay

Turnips – Purple Top, White Globe, White Lady
