When making your advance preparations for a hurricane, have you wondered if there is more you could or should do to get ready for a storm? Herb White, I'On At Home member, has not experienced a hurricane firsthand, but has forecasted several during more than 2 decades in the Carolinas as a meteorologist with the National Weather Service. Herb will present some tropical cyclone basics and then discuss information that will help you prepare before a storm threatens. You will be able to take home some on-line resources and lists for preparations. Participants are encouraged to share lists and resources that have helped them prepare for past storms.

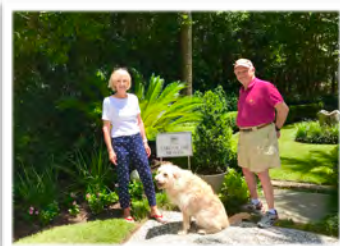
Yard Of The Month

I'On's Community Garden

Fall Planting Season Begins

Planting for the fall is not on many gardener's lists as both gardeners and summer vegetables suffer from the July heat and humidity. It should be though - because August in our part of the world is the time to begin planting seeds indoors for transplanting or direct sowing in the garden for a whole new season. A fall garden can be superior to a summer garden: the weather is cooler, fewer insect pests and diseases to battle, and many new plants can be grown (many producing until frost or freezing weather or over the winter). Imagine all the tasty meals you can enjoy from vegetables grown in your own garden bed or container.



Plants to start directly from seed early to mid-August: Pole Beans, Bush Lima Beans, Carrots, Collards, Cucumbers, Field Peas, Pumpkins, Winter Squash, Brussel Sprouts

From mid to late-August try: Bush beans, Beets, Kale, Broccoli, Summer Squash

Peak Season For Butterflies Is Starting

Many I'On BG plants are growing profusely and providing nectar for adult butterflies and leaves for their caterpillars to eat. For humans, the garden is a feast for the eyes. With cooler weather anticipated the next couple of weeks, it is a great time to visit the garden to see all the blooming plants and look for visiting butterflies - and caterpillars. They are often hiding under the leaves to avoid detection by predators! They play an important role in the cycle of life as food for other animals - from wasps and dragonflies to anoles and birds. Unfortunately, it is human impacts on the environment, not predators, that threaten butterflies' survival. The I'On Butterfly Garden reflects our community's commitment to providing a means for many of these beautiful creatures to flourish.
