"Our plan is to provide expert information and research to the HOA and to our neighbors to give them natural ways to address issues in our community," says Carol Degnen.

Plantings on Eastlake's North Shore

Working with Clemson University Extension Service and other pond management experts, the group made recommendations to the HOA to have installed a section of new plantings along Eastlake's north shore. The HOA agreed, since these plantings provide a natural way of reducing the elements that cause algae blooms. The algae blooms are primarily caused by erosion, chemical contaminants from run-off from landscaping and gardens and animal waste from pets and waterfowl.

Collection of Toxic Waste on Earth Day

In celebration of 2022 Earth Day on Saturday, April 23, the group is initiating the first collection of household hazardous materials that can seep into our water supply and create fumes that pollute our air if they end up in landfills. Six teams will gather items including paint, insecticides, fertilizers, cleaning supplies and batteries from their immediate neighborhoods and deliver the items to the Household Hazardous Waste Recycling Center. If the collection is successful, the I'On Eco Group will plan hazardous waste collections monthly in different areas within our neighborhood.

A Master Gardener will be at the group's table to answer questions about organic gardening and native plants. 

Yard of the Month/Gift to the Street Award Program 2022

The Landscaping Committee is pleased to announce that the Yard of the Month/Gift To The Street Award Program 2022 will begin in April. As an integral part of the overall beautification project of I'On, the purpose of the program is to recognize and reward the efforts of our residents who take special pride in their homes and gardens, and who inspire others to do the same.

This year the program will be run seasonally with awards for Spring, Summer and Fall along with awards for our Favorite Halloween and Holiday House decorations in October and December. As in previous years, **Yard of the Month** candidates will be



judged solely on the exterior appearance of the property that can be viewed from the street, lake, canal, and/or marsh trail. Yards will be judged on neatness, landscaping and color. Overall appearance including pruned and trimmed trees and shrubs, healthy, defined and weed-free lawns, borders and flower beds will be considered. Originality and creativity in color and textures, garden art, hanging baskets and pots, and a well maintained ROW strip are also important.

The **Gift to the Street Award** offers recognition to our homeowners who do not have a "yard" but who nevertheless contribute to the beauty of I'On. When it comes to enhancing the public realm, hardscaping details can be as beautiful as landscaping and many I'On homeowners contribute to I'On's streetscape by way of incorporating unique architectural features into their home's facade. These include elegant front entrances and window trim details, columns, brick fences, fountains, iron gates, balconies, planters and inviting courtyards. The Gift to the Street Award helps to acknowledge and reinforce the importance of the relationship between the public and private realms that distinguish I'On from other subdivisions.

Our Yard of the Month and Gift to the Street Awards are our way to recognize and reward I'On homeowners for their contribution to the overall beauty and uniqueness of our neighborhood whether by a meticulously kept garden, an elegant architectural detail or a handsome hardscape feature.

March Freeze a Challenge for Community Gardeners

Enthusiasm for getting new gardens growing muted the normal caution to hold off on planting warm weather crops such as tomatoes and squash in case Mother Nature might disagree with this optimistic assessment.

Unfortunately, on March 12 Mother Nature shockingly decided to lob near record cold on South Carolina, including our Lowcountry garden. Some gardeners with tender annuals struggled valiantly to cover and hopefully save their newly planted gardens.

Results were mixed. Many less hardy plants, such as much beloved young tomatoes, were lost and have had to be replanted. More cold-tolerant brassicas (cabbages, kale, and other greens), alliums (onions and garlic), peas, and even artichokes faced minimal damage. Some lucky gardeners waited until later in March to plant and are now seeing thriving tomatoes, peppers, and squash. The garden as a whole is getting greener and more beautiful every day as warm weather has returned. All of us are crossing our fingers that no more unpleasant Spring surprises lie ahead and that we will soon be enjoying the wonderful vegetables, herbs, and flowers now growing in our garden plots.

Gardeners tend to be a patient and determined lot willing to persist despite challenges and adversity. Butterfly Garden

Wanted: a Few Dedicated Gardeners and Nature Lovers

Founded in 2015, the I'On Butterfly Garden attracts many people of all ages from I'On and elsewhere who love to see the myriad butterflies and blooming native plants that grow there. Although the mission of the garden is to provide a peaceful and beautiful natural area for people to enjoy, it also promotes community education and participation in meeting important environmental objectives.

Those objectives involve increasing appreciation for the role pollinators and native plants play in the environment and then acting on that knowledge. For instance, most of our food crops are pollinated by insects, and these insects need native plants to meet their survival needs. Other animals, such as birds, need insects and native plants to feed themselves and their young. Without our help, the current downward spiral in the numbers and diversity of many insects, native plants, and birds will worsen and threaten not just them, but us. With growing awareness and experience, we hope that people will incorporate a new conservation ethic into their own gardens and landscapes and encourage others to do so as well. This includes encouraging policymakers to promote the protection of pollinators and native plants.

Here is where dedicated people are vital to our butterfly garden. When the garden began, it was created by and planted by I'On residents and funded by I'On organizations. It continues to be maintained by community support including the efforts of a special group of I'On neighbors called Team BG. Team BG consists of people who each year during the warm months sign up to work in the garden for a week and to help with occasional special garden-related activities. No prior knowledge or experience is required, only a concern to help the environment, a love for nature, and an interest in learning more about the issues involved.
